Um but the complaints got to be pretty uh pretty egregious in that the behavior of those individuals was becoming um pretty scary, pretty frightful.

After months of neighbors complaining about unlawful behavior in Nancy Guthri's neighborhood, the Pumas County Sheriff says enough is enough. Tonight, Sheriff Chris Nanos announcing a crackdown on the problem. News4 Tucson's Monica Garcia joins us live from the foothills to explain. And Monica, I know this has been a big issue. What do they plan to do about it?

>> That's right. And we just spoke with Sheriff Chris Nanos says who says he tried to respect the public interest surrounding this case. A lot of people want to know what's happening, right? Especially in the months after. And he's also trying to respect at the same time the rights of the people who live in this neighborhood. And let me just step aside. I wish everyone would quit [ \_\_ ] talking about the people in this neighborhood, okay?

Because all it's saying is that the people in this neighborhood hold more power than any other resident in Pima County. I don't understand what the [ \_\_ ] these news people are are are saying.

They even lied about me. I never p dude  
on my kids and on my life. I did not  
throw any piss. I look like I did, but I  
didn't throw any piss. And later on in  
the video, I even said I had my cameras  
on me, so I didn't want to be sounding  
like I had to piss. And really, I didn't  
have to piss, so I didn't piss. I pou  
threw an empty bottle. Now, let's just  
say I did. I didn't. I put that on  
everything I love. But let's just say I  
did.

You think I'm going to piss in here and then rinse it out and then use it to put my stuff in? Get the [ \_\_ ] out of here. I told the detective, "Go get the Go get the She even knew what it was. No, no,

it was a Pringles or a Lays. Go come get it." It was the same exact one.

So, we know whose directive this is under. Nanos, you're a dummy. You do.

This ain't the mafia, bro. This isn't the [ \_\_ ] mafia.

This is real people in a real in a real county, bro. You're not the boss of [ \_\_ ] And you indictments are coming for you. I promise. I promise. FBI hasn't liked you for a long time. And you haven't liked them. And it's going to be coming. So, I got a few videos to show everybody. I'm pissed. I got stuff to talk about. Just

>> warnings and requests for people to respect those that live in this neighborhood. That didn't work. So deputies began issuing citations that carry fines. Well, now going into the fifth month of this investigation, Nanos says some individuals that continue the same behavior despite those.

>> If my behavior isn't criminal, then my constitutional rights don't stop because people are uncomfortable.

And Nanos, given all this, why why are you all over that Catalina foothills nuts, Nanos? Why are you Why are you protecting them so much?

It's funny, man. You will go to prison

and you will not get out, Nanos, your old [ \_\_ ] ass. You'll probably kill yourself in the first [ \_\_ ] month, piece of [ \_\_ ] All that's coming back to you, not to me. I always tell my people, "Hey, this isn't about me or Juice. We don't We never do this because like it's going to be all about us." No. But you know what? as sure as keeping NY's name out there because that's exactly what we're doing. We're exercising our freedom of our first amendment, freedom of freedom of the speech and freedom of the press, our uh right to assemble. All those things are in our constitution. That was before all of us were even born, even before you, Nanos, you dumb [ \_\_ ]

And I'm going to read this real quick because it's important. every officer, cop, whatever, they take an oath. That oath is important. It's really important, guys. So, I'm going to even if you already know, I'm just going to I'm just going to show make sure I let you guys know and remind you that when you take an oath, it require it requires officials to one uphold the US Constitution. One that's what these are the oath you took. I didn't take it. You

took this you dummy.  
uphold the Arizona Constitution,  
faithfully, perform their duties,  
four, act impartially,  
protect civil rights,  
and finally, enforce laws without  
favoritism. It's pretty simple what your  
oath is, nonsense. I [ \_\_ ] hate you,  
bro. Not because I was in jail for  
[ \_\_ ] Oh, let's talk about the Let me  
finish this video and let me go back.  
Let me tell you guys about the jail  
situation.

>> Well, now they're going to be subject to  
arrest and possible jail time if their  
unlawful behavior continues. Take a  
listen.

>> If somebody's just out there from one of  
our local media outlets or even a  
YouTuber and they've not been cited,  
then fine. we'll give you a citation and  
expect you to be reasonable with us and  
not come back. But if we happen to look  
at you and say, "No, we you've you've  
received a ticket. You've been cited for  
this same behavior that didn't do you  
any good. I you you've up the ante for  
me, so we're going to now take you to  
jail."

>> Okay. So, the sheriff says the new  
policy is aimed at what he calls

habitual offenders. and he goes on to say that he has the support from the Pima County Attorney's Office in this latest move. We will have much more on this story. So, coming up tomorrow, we speak directly for the first time from neighbors who live in this area and they're going to talk to us about specifically what the sheriff was referring to this unlawful behavior that they've had to endure for months. Live in the foothills, I'm Monica Garcia. Sean, back to you.

>> Our neighbors need to heal. [ \_\_ ] off, dude. [ \_\_ ] off, Sue Ellen. [ \_\_ ] off, neighbors. I have that right to say that [ \_\_ ]

So, let's talk about the jail thing. Let me put this [ \_\_ ] piece of shit's face up here so everybody can see him. [ \_\_ ] fraud, man.

So, yesterday I got all kinds of texts early in the morning. 857 was uh in the neighborhood and he said that and even he told me I called him. He said, "Yeah, the sheriffs are looking for Alex." I'm like, "What should I do?" And then in he go ahead and call the non-emergency line. 857 suggested that. So I called him and uh I said, "Yeah, sheriffs were uh in the Catalina photos. They were

asking about me, so I'm just calling you to give you my phone number with the whoop." She goes, "Okay." And then so she took down, she goes, "Ask for my address." And I gave her my address. And um that was it. So I walked to the store, came back. Uh you know, you guys, if you guys saw, I think it was like 420. I was high as [ \_\_ ] And I was I was about to go live at five, I think.

Yeah. So anyway, so I knew they were looking for me and I mean I gave him my address. I didn't I know I didn't commit any felonies and I don't know what they were tripping on or misdemeanor really.

So I heard a knock later sheriff's office. So like I always do, I go to my window and slide the thing open and open the door and open the window cuz I know how it goes. I already guys told you my my dilemma that I had last time when I went outside and spoke to him, which it always is like that. So, I open up the window. The detective, she's right there. Detective Perez, you need to be a better better detective, girl.

You need to be a better detective.

You never saw me throw any pee. And I told you to go look at the video again.

Don't just look at little pieces of the video. If you're going to try to convict

me for something I did on a video, you better watch all [ \_\_ ] four hours. Uh, Perez.

So, I go, "Hey, how you doing?" She goes, "Yeah. Um, is there any way I can speak to you outside to ask you a couple questions?"

My dumb ass goes outside. [ \_\_ ] grabs me by, not her, another grabs me by my wrist and flings up. I go, "Dude." And me and them had a little uh not a scuffle, but just a discussion. He ain't just going to fling my arm up like that. I said, "Are you am I under arrest? What am I under?" Anyway, the thing that sucked is that my kids were next door.

Had to see that [ \_\_ ] Anyway, so they took me, she came and uh read me my rights down when I was in the back of the uh vehicle.

She asked if I wanted to speak. I said, "Yeah." She goes, "Well, you um public." She said it was criminal nuisance and then she changed it. She goes, "I meant to say public nuisance." Said, "Public?" I go, "Why?" "Cuz you threw urine." I go, "Did I?" She goes, "Yeah, you had a Pringles can and you came out of the pee tent and you threw your urine.

You mean the invisible air I threw out of that that can? Don't you guys, everybody that knows me knows that I do a lot of [ \_\_ ] a lot of [ \_\_ ] on purpose. A lot of [ \_\_ ] to see how certain things go. Just like when I walked behind the wash, behind all those houses, the the the car house, I was there on February 2nd in that back. I left four cigarette butts in four different areas just to see if they were doing any investigation because even if they found it, they would see that I had an alibi. In other words, I wasn't involved in it. But I was in the area. Yeah, I was. I was searching. Helicopter flew right over me.

So, we're in jail. I mean, I go to the, you know, they're they're bootsy. When you go into a county jail before you're whether you're booked or not, there should always be a phone. You should have a phone and be able to call your family. Should have a phone to call your attorney. You should be able to call bail bond. Not in Puma County. That's like the third room that you'll ever get to if you're lucky to even use a phone. So, I get into the first little booking area, right? All they I don't even think they they take maybe thumb

prints. I don't remember. And uh the detective has to wait back there. And I was there, I don't know, for a half hour. And then uh I hear somebody say, "Troy like and Troy comes walking around the corner." I'm like, "Motherfucker." So, I gave him a hug. I felt bad. We both just, you know, embraced. We were both disappointed, of course. So, a good hour later, I don't know, half hour, hour later, they take me out to the next, it's called pre pre-trial. That's what they call it. Pre-trial. So, pre-trial, it's like a big dorm, right? And then there's like courtrooms over here. Of course, it was already late, so I wouldn't have even been able to make it to court, but so people stay the night right there until their court date. And then you go to general gen pop. So when they brought me in there pre-trial, instead of putting me in the dorm, they put me in the hole till 10:00 from 4 to 10:00. And in the hole, there's no phone. You go into the room, there's just a wall, a toilet, no chair, no bed. No nothing, not even no toilet paper. I

was there for the next 10 uh six hours.  
Got an argument with numerous  
uh deputies. They were happy to see me  
there. They were enjoying it. You could  
tell it was by under someone's  
directive.

And it wasn't until uh  
let me see. I need to see this.

Uh, so two YouTube streamers were  
arrested last night outside. Well, one  
was actually arrested at his house. The  
other was arrested outside Nancy  
Guthrie's house. uh and the circumstances  
are a little confusing about why they  
were arrested uh if they were on public  
property. But let me read you. I just  
got a a um statement from the Pima  
County Sheriff's Office. It says today  
the Puma and this this came to me last  
night actually. Uh the Pima County  
Sheriff's Department arrested three  
individuals who identified themselves as  
social media streamers in the Foothills  
neighborhood where Nancy Guthrie was  
reported missing. The sheriff's  
department has received numerous  
complaints.

>> Let's not forget though, uh, Brian and  
all that, man. He's the one who put he's  
the one who put labeled us early on, the  
ones without credentials who label stuff

like we're playing a video game.

>> It's about individuals blocking roadways, trespassing, and disrupting the peace in the neighborhood.

>> Where are we trespassing? What the [ \_\_ ] are they talking about, guys? You guys watch us live.

Deputies initially issued warnings followed by the posting of no trespassing signs and the issuance of citations for violations. Despite those efforts, some individuals continued to disregard the law. After reviewing video evidence showing one of the arrestees urinating in public behind a makeshift tent,

>> okay, let's talk about that. It's not a makeshift tent, you dumb [ \_\_ ] It's a pee tent. And you want to know why? Because we're not allowed to use the portaotties apparently in the neighborhood. We're not white enough. I guess Anton, you dumb [ \_\_ ] If you're going to be I thought you had to vet everything out before you [ \_\_ ] talk about it publicly. I gave you all kinds of nuggets. You're like, "Oh, no. We got to vet it out." Well, vet this one out, you [ \_\_ ] Okay, vet this one out. Did you see me pee and throw urinate? I don't care what the what the uh thing

you're reading is saying. Did you look into it? Show me some piss,

[ \_\_ ]

>> Sheriff Chris Nanos has directed deputies. And the only way to not get charged with uh public uh indecency, and I looked it up, was to get a [ \_\_ ] pee tent. Okay, which makes sense. Okay, the kids might be walking by. You don't want to be taking a piss when you Oh, I didn't see somebody and then someone walks up. Okay, so you have a [ \_\_ ] pee tent.

[ \_\_ ] wrong with people, man? The ordinance says you could get dropped off and picked up. You can't get you can't get uh you can't park there. Okay. What do you think getting dropped off means? We're playing hideand-seek now with the cops. What the [ \_\_ ] are you guys saying? You guys have to make sense because you know what? It's playing out in real life and real time. And you know what? You guys are looking like idiots. You guys are looking so [ \_\_ ] dumb. And you know what? Everybody, everybody, even law enforcement is embarrassed about you, Nanos. Do you know that? Does Charlene tell you that? Cuz she should, dude. They are embarrassed as [ \_\_ ] of what

your husband has done to this [ \_\_ ]  
county, bro. Brought nothing but debt  
and [ \_\_ ]  
and lined his own [ \_\_ ] pockets.

>> To take stronger enforcement approach.

Um, Sheriff Nanos will no longer  
tolerate behavior that disrupts the  
community or violates the law. Effective  
immediately, individuals found.

>> Yeah. But on the way to jail, guys, four  
bus, I counted them just because four  
bus stops. As we pass by, as I'm in  
handcuffs, there's people smoking  
fentanyl at the bus stops. You feel me?  
You see the selective enforcement I'm  
talking about?

>> Violation of the law may be cited and  
released on the first offense. However,  
repeat offenders may be arrested and  
booked into the

>> repeat offenders. Dude, I never even got  
a [ \_\_ ] citation. So, why don't you  
look into it, Enton, you [ \_\_ ]

>> County Adult Detention Center um on  
charges of public nuisance. And that's  
what's interesting, like, is it actually  
a public nuisance to be outside Nancy  
Guthrie's house on public property? I'm  
not sure. Two of these uh three  
individuals were booked into the Puma  
County uh jail. Alexander Zable Jr., 54

charged with two counts of obstructing a highway or thoroughfare and one count of public nuisance.

>> Show me what I obstructed.

I didn't obstruct the cars driving by going 80 miles [ \_\_ ] hour. I never obstructed anybody.

And perhaps we couldn't sit on an easement to get away out of to get out of the roadway because somebody put [ \_\_ ] over there. And now we know who did it and she admitted it on tape. What a dummy. Troy Lewis Bradshaw charged with one count of public nuisance and a third individual Damian Enderly charged with one count of public nuisance cited and released. The Puma County Deputies Organization which is the union that represents the deputies also posted something about this saying um the deputies involved in the arrest yesterday will likely face discipline um for their honesty about who ordered it. Their commanders so confident of the charges should have had no issue putting their names at the bottom of the site. the only good thing he said in this [ \_\_ ] thing

>> instead they want to hide behind their deputies. So it seems like the deputies union is not

>> reading whether he's reading a statement or not I I get it. Okay, but he should bet it out

>> about these arrests. Um they said this evening two subjects were arrested as they were live streaming in the Guthri neighborhood. arrest.

>> I wasn't live streaming in the neighborhood.

>> Order personally came from sheriff.

>> Oh go I I I see you guys. You have to listen. Okay. I'm still I'm mad. I'm allowed to talk about if you guys don't like how I talk about him. Okay. I don't give a [ \_\_ ] That's how I feel right now. I don't like him.

>> Thanos via chain of command. The public can once again see why we fight so hard to rid ourselves of him. So, I've heard complaints from the neighbors about just like the streamers being in the neighborhood non-stop. Um, but again, the question I have, and I'm going to look into it, is legally, is it a public nuisance to be on public property on the side of the road outside Nancy Guthri's house? Would I get arrested now or get a citation if I went out there to do live shots for News Nation?

>> No, because you could have a [ \_\_ ] tent in Sue Allen's yard.

Jeez Louise. audience.

Um um we're aware of that people are being arrested in front of Nancy Guthri's house. So for the chat, uh I've we've seen it. So uh let's focus on this conversation right now and then we'll address that uh later on. Um, and you know, if people are being arrested on a public street for covering a a crime, then just real fast, my recommendation is uh get a civil attorney. Uh, you're going to own Puma County. Uh, okay. That said, let's move to the next uh slide here.

I use the word YouTubers. Um, It's funny because I was going to have some other stuff for uh Nanos the other day. Let me open this one up.

We now turn to some breaking news. The Pima County Sheriff's Department has confirmed a Tucson YouTuber and volunteer search organizer has been arrested in a crackdown on unlawful behavior in Nancy Guthri's Catalina Foothills neighborhood. DCSD says Alexander Zable, who runs the True Crime Page Criminal Network, was taken into custody at his home before 6:00 p.m. Zable faces two counts of obstruction of a highway or public thoroughfare. We're told he had been active in Guthri's

neighborhood since her disappearance  
despite being cited before by police.

I found some really good stuff.

>> Hi, my name is Chris Nanos and I'm running for sheriff of Pima County. I'm not a politician. I'm a cop. I know several people ask me, "Well, if you're not a politician, why are you running for sheriff?"

>> Right?

>> For one, I think it doesn't hurt that I have over 41 years of experience as a law enforcement officer. I've stood up to thugs and bullies.

>> That's right.

>> Strong for the victims of our community.

And I now ask that you stand with me and help me serve you as your next sheriff.

You want us to stand with you? Dude, you're 5 foot4.

So, let me see. I think it's better.

How do you feel about police reform, Nanos? Can you have anything?

>> When I speak of priorities, I look at two things. One, priorities for my community. and two priorities for my agency, my department. And when I talk about my community, the priority is reform. When I hear people talk of defund the police, I'm not thinking we're going to just take money away from

the cops and make the cops go away. I don't think anybody's thinking that way. I believe what they're trying to say is let's find those programs that we as law enforcement have been given and tasked with and challenged with that we're really not the best suited for. We're very illquipped at dealing with those who suffer from mental illness, those who suffer from substance abuse and addiction. Those people should be in facilities that can deal with those problems, not a locked jail cell, not with some 18, 19 year old kid who had 11 weeks of training to be a corrections officer. They never took on the job saying, "I'm going to be a psychiatrist. I'm going to be a a rehab counselor." No, they can't.

They know what they signed up for. So he's talking about Yeah, cuz you got to be a counselor. You got to do this. You got to do that. Yeah, that's part of being a [ \_\_ ] cop.

Dude, there's nothing, dude. I'm I'm embarrassed that he's in charge of this county. Like, everybody sees you, bro. Like, it's not just me that sees how dumb you are, but you're dumb, bro. You're dumb. You've bamboozled a lot of people,

but you never bamboozled me. Man,  
>> in there to say, "I'm going to keep you  
safe." I was doing reform before it  
became the politically correct thing to  
do.

I reduced our jail population by 30%. I  
worked with Chief Justice Scott Bales  
from Arizona on bail situations. I  
worked with our mental health community  
and set up a community board.

I have mental health issues documented  
for decades. Okay? Nobody deescalated  
anything with me in the jail, out of the  
jail. So you can [ \_\_ ] off talking all  
that [ \_\_ ]

>> that we can deal with those struggling  
with mental illness and addiction.

>> My name is Chris Nanos and I'm running  
for sheriff of Pima County and I can't  
do that job without your vote. For  
leadership you can count on. Vote Nanos  
for sheriff.

>> Dude, and you know why I'm showing all  
these? because I want to know I want  
people to see just how dumb you really  
are.

>> Hi, my name is Chris Nanos and I'm  
running for sheriff of Puma County.

>> This is a little different.

>> I'm not a politician. I'm a cop.

>> I know several people ask me, well, if

you're not a politician,

>> why are you running for sheriff?

The morale never lower.

>> They say they need a new leader.

>> I think they wanted you to run away is what they Many people told them to run.

Yeah. Run, [ \_\_ ] Out of here.

>> They say they want their department back.

>> Yeah.

>> More importantly, they believe I'm the one who can bring it back. I've spent a lifetime with this agency, starting at the ground floor all the way through to the top. a lifetime.

You're from El Paso, bro.

>> I know its intricacies, its history, its people,  
and they know me. They know who I am, what I stand for. They know my character.

>> Hey guys,  
that's his backyard.

There's the golf course right there.

This is a This is 9800

Sabino Estates. And if you didn't have a gate in the front of it, I'd go park in front of your house, honest.

Cuz you're the opposite of transparency, bro.

But that's his house. I just realized that. I've watched this a few times. I forgot. It's right. That's his That's his one of his back patios right there.

Must be nice, Nos.

You can see the whole town from there, huh? They know. Must

>> be nice and safe and everything.

>> They are more than just co-workers. They are family. I love this department and I love this community.

>> He loves this department because he's already cut out all the ones he didn't like.

>> Well, we do have serious problems here. Problems that I could better solve.

>> Every lady in that picture was taller

than none.

>> As a sheriff

>> rather than a retired sheriff. Our deputies and corrections officers are leaving in record numbers and they're not being replaced. Recruitment is at an all-time low.

money.

>> Our jail is ridiculously overcrowded,

>> dude. He's he's running for sheriff and he's asking for money already. Her horrifically understaffed.

This presents a danger not only to the inmates, but the corrections officers and my staff as well. Number of deputies on our streets that are keeping you safe every night are now at an all-time low, making response times to critical calls.

>> They're low.

>> Way too long,

>> dude. I had four [ \_\_ ] uh Puma County Sheriff vehicles and a detective in her [ \_\_ ] blue Honda.

>> Leadership is spent more time in Washington DC and hiding behind their desk than they are on our streets. I believe that the best way to lead is by example. And I set that example every day by volunteering and being involved in my community. not just attending political events, but actually

volunteering for our nonprofits,  
churches, our schools, the institutes  
that make this community a better place.

This is particularly important to our  
youth.

>> In addition, I would push for increased  
support for our own community school  
resource officers,

>> indictments,

>> a program that had disappeared for  
decades until just recently brought it  
back

>> federal. Well, you see, if you have a  
department that has the mindset of a  
guardian versus that of a warrior, we  
can accomplish great things. I've stood  
up to thugs and bullies, and I've stood  
strong for the victims of our community,  
and I now ask that you stand with me,

>> the bully.

>> Serve you,

>> sheriff. Thank you.

>> That's your next bully.

I thought this was cool right here.

Check it out.

I think it has sound  
though street racing.

And I think it took hella long for for  
them to cut the cops even be there as  
they start closing it down. They're like  
in LA we see those all the time.

Sometimes you just pop stop and just watch because you're like in one of the cars back here watching. You're like sauce. Let them [ \_\_ ] their tires up.

>> Hi.

>> Been 127 days since the disappearance of Nancy Guthrie. Investigators continue to sip through clues as they work to find answers. And this afternoon, Today Show co-host Savannah Guthrie took to social media to once again post about her mom. In an Instagram story today that includes a picture of religious artwork,

Savannah wrote, "Oh my, my soul, it cries out, soul, it cries out, bring her home." It's now been more than 4 months since her mom went missing. And today, our cameras were back in Nancy Guthrie's neighborhood. And the shrine to Nancy that was up at the curb at her home for more than four months has been taken down. The 84-year-old Guthrie was believed to have been abducted from her Catalina Foothills home near Campbell and Skyline in the middle of the night back on February 1st. Investigators have still not revealed a motive or a suspect. Pima County deputies and the FBI say it's never too late to call with information and those numbers are right there on your screen. If you have any information in this case, please call 1800 call FBI or 88 crime. For continuing coverage on this case, stay with kboa.com and all of our social media platforms.

>> Lives matters movement. It isn't about black lives are better than whites, black lives are better than Hispanics, black lives are more important than Asian. It's that you're missing the point. Black Lives Matter movement is simply saying for 250 years we've been left out of the discussion when it comes

to equality. We just want to be treated equal. We don't want to be treated better. There's something wrong in your system. And particularly when you look probably the realest thing he's ever said, the only thing he doesn't abide by that or live by that. He's a professional bullshitter

>> at the judicial system. The system that's supposed to be blind to justice. They actually have numbers to back that up. Almost 40% of our prisons are filled with African-American males. Yet they make up 12 maybe 12.8% of our population.

You have to look at your own self and deal with your own racial biases before I could ever expect to impact somebody else.

That's learned behavior.

If my attitude is such that I laugh at the off-color joke,

what have I just told those who are watching,

>> the young officers and young deputies

who are looking up at me?

>> So when we talk about training, but I really believe with all my heart, we hire the best. When they go south, it's because we failed. The leaders of that organization failed first. I need to teach you how to communicate, how to deescalate, how to talk to people, how to talk people down, how to calm yourself down. Those are the skill sets that a real cop needs. We need to train those people how to do the job, not as a warrior, but as a guardian.

For leadership you can count on, vote Nanos for sheriff.

>> Sheriff Nanos explains why he built the cafe so close for his employees at the jail.

>> How do we get it filled? It's not easy to get somebody in here because you have to first of all have a background. But when Chris said, you know, I could get my niece, she does a catering service, she'll come in here and charge us nothing. I thought, well, we don't want any money for it. I didn't want to make money on the deal. I just wanted to give my employees something cheap, a decent meal. You see where we're at? You got 20 minutes to get to a restaurant and back and have your food done. Some places it's not possible. Heck with this preliminary investigation. Why are you doing a preliminary investigation? I want the FBI to send this case, take it away from the director here. He's already showed his bias. He is biased on this case. He's already done that. He's shown it. And I'd like them to take it away from here, send it to Phoenix, send

it to Washington DC, and start a fullblown investigation.

>> Sheriff Nano says that if the FBI does find anything, his department is willing to cooperate. By the way, you can watch this entire interview on our website, [kgon9.com](http://kgon9.com).

>> Is anything not just about him?

It's kind of funny, man.

This is what I was going to show you guys yesterday, some of these, and then I found a couple new ones. So, hope you guys are I'm going to open up the panel a little bit. Apparently, I'm not going out there today. So, let's see.

This is

>> Hello, I'm Kevin Ager, media specialist with the Pum County Sheriff's Department and joining me is Sheriff Chris Nanos.

Thanks for joining me.

>> Absolutely.

>> Uh, you've been in office for 100 days.

>> Thanks for the reminder.

>> So, we wanted to talk to you about your first 100 days. Uh, we would like to give the community a look at what has happened in these first 100 days. So, I have a list of questions that I'm going to grill you with. Um, so let's get

started. Uh, first question, what has it been like this first 100 days for you?

>> It's been a horse race. It's, um, it's been awesome. It really has been awesome. Uh, um, just busy as can be, as one would expect. Uh, certainly there's its challenges we've seen. um came in here, you know, I'd been here before and I thought I knew everything and got here and realized it's a lot more to to a lot's happened over the last four years and we're just kind of adjusting to that.

>> Okay. Um did you set any goals for the first 100 days that you got into office?

Thanks.

>> Well, you know, I did I I naturally reform was a big issue for me. Um, and and I'm a little um a little disappointed in in not being able to get there where I want to be with reform, but we're moving forward. We've done a lot of things there. It's just my mindset is let's get this done. Let's let I I want it I wanted it done yesterday. So, we we're working towards some things there. There's some great things going on in reform. Internally, we had a number of challenges that needed to be met, and I think that's what slowed us down where we're at with

our reform efforts. Internally, the number one issue was staffing, and I didn't see a point to to come out with a gabble and say, "I need more bodies without doing some research." Um, I think our staffing levels when I left were over 1500. Today, they're 1376. Uh, is is is 1500 the right number? is 1376 the right number? I'm guessing it's somewhere in between, but what I need to do is study those things and I need to get with my team and look at how can we best use the resources we now have. And so one of the things we did was we took a body of of deputies that was designated for rural patrol in the three points area, some 10 deputies, a couple of sergeants lieutenant, and we said I need them in veil. And the reason being is simply this.

We don't let politics dictate where our staffing needs are. We let calls for service dictate those needs.

Green Valley averages 7,200 calls a year. Tucson Mountain averages over 7,000 calls a year. Veil averages over 7,000 calls a year. The difference is Green Valley, Tucson Mountain have a district, have a station, a team of people working there. we don't invail. So, we've done that. We've moved them

out there. They're opening an office here within the next few days, actually. But the staffing is there. So, that's one of the things. But also, I need to look at our staffing needs in terms of how have we utilized our resources over the last 40, 50 years. You know, in the last 40, 50 years, we haven't made any changes with our districting. Even though we've seen great annexation in the Northwest, particularly with Moran and Oral Valley, we've not done anything with staffing to to to to blend that. We did build a substation, one substation in the last 40 years, Tucson Mountain. All of our resources have always been in the Foothills District, probably rightfully so. But why wouldn't you take a look at that district today and say are those needs still in existence with all the annexation an additional substation maybe we can reconfigure some of that the Santa station is now in the middle of the city it can take over an hour to get to your assigned duties why not take that stationary centralize it in the Santa district put it in the middle of the district where you can take advantage of a bigger police presence and help those people in the three points areas where I just took

those 10 deputies from. By better servicing them, having them closer to those areas, they get a faster response time as well. So, those are the things we're looking at before I go off and say, I need more bodies. And we're we're moving that way. It's doing well. It's a number of things. We're building a new police hanger. We just took possession possession of our two aircrafts. um just a lot going on internally that has slowed down what I what I really want to accomplish and that's the reform efforts. The reform efforts are quite easy. We're already um work with Mr. Huckleberry and the board uh to get it on on the next budget agenda to uh fund our body cameras. Um and we had an Axom come in and give a demonstration. I'm jazzed up, excited. It can do a lot of things for us, but one of the biggest things we're doing is um looking at an officer involved shooting u uh uh regionalization effort. We already regionalize our SWAT team and our the deployment of SWAT, the deployment of bomb techs and we utilize the the other agencies within the county to do those efforts. We're now looking at doing the very same thing with our officer involved shooting so that there is more

transparency out there. Um where and you eliminate that conflict where there may be a deputy involved in a shooting and we will conduct our own internal parallel investigation out on the side but the actual investigation the criminal part of that will be handled by our partners in the regional efforts that we have.

>> Okay. You talked about body cameras. So

I'll go to that right now. Um

body cameras are a hot topic.

Everybody's talking about we should have them, we shouldn't have them. you know, how soon and when could body cameras be on deputies uh for the P County Sheriff's Department?

>> My well, so it's on the budget. The budget would be approved for July 1.

>> Do we am I going to have those body cameras ready to go July 1? I hope so.

But it will be soon. If not, if not July

1, just as soon as possible afterwards.

The We have to have the funding there.

We're already putting together a task force to look at the needs. Do I need cameras in the jail? Do I need cameras in my de detectives? Do I need cameras in the streets? Who should have them in the streets? Should lieutenants and captains have them or should it be

sergeants?

We're looking at all of those things now before July comes so we can have some numbers in place of what our needs are and be ready to go on day one.

>> What would you like to see? Would you like deputy specific or is it still?

>> Oh, absolutely. I think I think for me it's deputies and sergeants number one.

They're the first ones out on the street. the the young men who and young ladies who get that call to respond to your house cuz you need us now. Those people need the cameras first.

>> Okay. All right. Uh so we're going to wrap things up. Anything you want to close with to say to the public? You know, any anything you want to close with?

>> You know, I'm just blessed. I I really am. Um

>> I have a great team. I have a lot of people who have the biggest hearts and they just want to do their job. They they we want stay out of the politics. Let's just get out there and do our jobs.

>> All right.

>> And and we'll be good.

>> All right. Thank you so much for everyone else for joining us.

>> Thank you.

>> Thank you for watching. I'm Kevin County Sheriff's Department.

>> I have a boo.

>> Tell me that [ \_\_ ] ain't [ \_\_ ] He's so dumb.

I'm embarrassed for him, too. I'm

embarrassed for all of us as

Puma County residents.

Bear, you hanging with us.

Let's see.

Tonight with the Pima County Sheriff

Chris Nanos responding publicly for the

first time since his deputy chief deputy

was indicted.

>> As you all know, recent events have shaken this organization to its core.

>> [ \_\_ ] bubbles.

>> This follows our story last week on the

whistleblowers who prompted an FBI

investigation into how the sheriff's

department uses RICO funds, money seized

from criminals. Now, your side

investigative reporter Valerie Kvasos

has been following the story. She joins

us live with the very latest. Val.

Yeah, Sheriff Chris Nanos read from a

script and he would not take any

questions from the media. He split the

statements into two parts. Now, first,

he said he would conduct a comprehensive

review of all procedures. He says mistakes may have been made and this has been a learning process for him.

>> I will be meeting with each and every commander within this organization.

I will take the time necessary to explain to the extent I understand and I'm able to disclose and how and why recent events came to be. I cannot and will.

Bro, he's like the opposite of Chad GPT. Dude, that's the He really read that and said he what I can

>> I cannot and will not tarnish this office that's been trusted.

>> Oh, you've tarnished it, bro.

>> To me, nor will I allow without consequence anyone else to do the same.

This comes that's been trusted to me.

Nor will I

>> This comes just a week after our investigation into the FBI probe.

Multiple whistleblowers came forward about problems with senior command. The focus on the FBI investigation. Sheriff Nanos, former chief of staff Brad Gagnapain, who just months ago committed suicide, and chief deputy Chris Ratkkey now indicted for misuse of RICO funds,

monies that should be used to fight crime. but instead hundreds of thousands of dollars may have been moved to another account for years and may have been used to pay for annual awards, banquetss, uh uh kitchen equipment and furniture. Now, we've also in the second half of the statement, he blasted Dr. Richard Cremona, the primary whistleblower in the FBI investigation, calling the allegations blatant lies. Now, however, we've spoken to a number of insiders who back up Carmona's claims. Now, we just got this this just in. Uh this is the indictment uh Chris Rakis, the chief deputies indictment from the FBI. So, it's being made public for the first time. Now, I'm reading a little into this and this is a very key part of this. The defendant and others known and unknown to the grand jury conspired to make it appear that the forfeite funds were being used by the SAV by using SAV checks and the SAV credit card for uh to pay for items that were actually purchased for the sheriff's office and individuals affiliated with the defendant. The SAV is the sheriff's auxiliary volunteers. It's a nonprofit entity. Now, the following are examples of approximately

half a million dollars of financial transactions affecting interstate and foreign commerce that were designed in whole or in part to conceal and disguise the nature, location, source, ownership, and control of the proceeds of unspecified unlawful activity. And then there's details that follow this. Um, again, this is just in. We were not able to ask Nanos any questions and it was before this press conference was before this indictment uh was made available to the public. We'll have much more coming up at six o'clock. Reporting from the sheriff's department, Valerie,

>> whatever. What's up, Gigi?

>> What's good, bro? Okay.

>> Yeah.

>> I was jumping through phones. This was wild.

>> Stupid, huh? And they're doing it. Like do they not realize that the world is able to see it?

You going to say effective today when you ain't notified nobody, you ain't post nothing. You just told the other fella he was okay,

>> right? Um, it was a setup because he rolled up, asking about you, and then he tells him he's okay, and then an hour or two later, he comes back and sightes the guy. What the hell's going on around there?

>> Yeah. I mean,

>> wow, bro. But don't worry about it.

Don't worry about it.

>> Yeah. I love it that we do have this this this amount of like just support and words of encouragement and like, you know, it was sad. GG is this one lady uh I don't want to cry but anyway she said that she was watching and then she saw Juice got erect arrested and and that her mother cry was crying and I'm like that's how big it is to people you know.

>> Yeah.

>> Will it is that we're not playing this

[ \_\_ ] ordinance game and all this  
other [ \_\_ ] We're out here for  
Nancy. And if this is what it takes to  
get NY's name out there even more good  
because that guy needs to I  
Luther King, they did the same things.  
Locked him up, did this, did that, and  
he was fighting for the people,  
>> you know. So sometimes these things have  
to occur to get to where you need to go,  
you know? Hate to see this, but  
>> Right. Right. We're tough. We're tough.  
And it's not about us, but we're tough.  
And we we're gonna get through this  
[ \_\_ ] It it it doesn't help him.  
>> Sheriff Chris Nano said an emotional  
affair.  
>> Sorry. Go ahead.  
>> I said it doesn't help him look like  
he's not involved in a situation. You  
know, it really makes him look like  
>> his own people are embarrassed. Uh some  
of those people didn't even want to  
arrest Juice.  
>> The woman came over to me. She would you  
could tell it was her own directive, but  
she obviously didn't watch the whole  
video or she would have known.  
>> Yeah. I think they're just all doing  
what they're told. Simply put, you know,  
um

>> simply

>> I will say, and you know, my father's a retired police officer. I will tell you, um as a cop, that's all you have is your integrity.

>> And when you have a leader who's making your your integrity be up for question, I don't know if I'd remain there. I'm not saying I'd walk out and quit today, but I'd definitely be find somewhere else to be.

>> But it's your livelihood, and that's the hard part of what if you are there to do the right thing. That's what sucks because then yeah, like you said, then you have to go look for another job somewhere because

>> you're right. That's zero integrity. It's the opposite, you know.

>> Listen to this. It's only like 43 seconds. This is when uh Nanosh retired in 2016.

>> Puma County Sheriff Chris Nano said an emotional farewell to his department during a retirement ceremony today. He was appointed last year to replace retired Sheriff Clarence Dupnik. He was defeated in November. He wished incoming sheriff elect Mark Napier well and commented on the election results.

>> It's not using that much. It's leaving.

I I enjoyed so many people in this organization and in this community and I continue to enjoy those memories.

>> Nanos worked for the sheriff's sheriff's department for more than 32 years. He says now he'll look for other ways to serve the community.

>> What's up, Nick?

>> Hey, what's up, brother?

>> How you doing, man?

>> Good, man. Hanging in there. What's going on,

>> man? Just want to make sure I told you thank you again. I already

>> Oh, man. Yeah, absolutely.

Yeah. He's like

>> he's proud.

>> Seems like he's proud of it.

>> Yeah. And I'm like, "So, is it all the neighbors up there that called this in or is it just this one dude who used Now he's saying he used a bunch of different AI voices to file complaints on you and Juice?"

>> Like, is he bragging about now that he got this all,

>> you know what I mean? Like, it's really really weird. I think it that way because I did a live about it

>> um two days ago that he posted it and he took it down that that's what he did. He

posted it real quick and somebody saw it and he pulled it down.

>> Pulled it down. Yeah. It's it's just really odd. And then they were in my chat last night and luckily my mods were able to jump on them and remove them. But that's what this whole thing looks like. And honestly, you know, I think we can get as much of that evidence together and kind of, you know, put it with the paperwork and then let it come backfire on them.

>> Uhhuh.

>> You know what I mean? That they're pretty much doxing. That's all they were doing was they were doxing Alex and Juice. I mean, Alex wasn't even there.

>> Yeah. They came to my house.

>> Like, what the

>> They just making up [ \_\_ ] But thank you, Nick, for so much for going out there for them guys. I appreciate that.

>> Oh, yeah. Oh, it was that was a great night last night. A lot of people came together.

>> That was awesome, man.

>> Absolutely. A lot of people came together last night. Good stuff. Good stuff.

>> Cause and if it keeps NY's name out there, then hey, we'll just say we're

they're still looking for their money.

Really? Really?

>> Come on, man.

>> Yeah, that's what I was saying, too.

After you guys got arrested, I said, "At least, you know what? I bet both of them are thinking, "Well, at least if this gets out into the media, it's going to put NY's name back out there." And that's, you know, that's exactly what we're shooting for. We're not shooting for people to get arrested, but at least it's put her name back out there,

>> right? We're still going to exercise our First Amendment rights. I mean,

>> died for us to have those rights. So, if we don't exercise them, you know?

>> Yeah. God, I felt so bad for Jews, man.

>> Me, too, man. That hurt.

That was

>> Here's another thing I forgot to tell everybody else is the reason that they had me in the hole when I was in there for the six hours is because

>> we they considered us as codefendants.

>> So even though we were arrested at different times, we couldn't be near each other. So he could have come out and used the phone and then I could come out and use the phone. It just took them I was just throwing a fit.

>> Yeah. So ba and basically when it was whoever was doing the reporting of it was saying was using both of your guys' names. Well, it's these two guys.

They're the ones that are up there causing a nuisance doing this, doing that, doing you know. So that's why

>> because have them together

>> on the way out the sheriff when the deputy was taking me out, he's like, "So do you have a a problem with Bradshaw or you guys have beef or something?" I go,

"No, that's my friend." Goes, "Oh,

because you we were told to keep you guys separate." I go, "Yeah, figures."

They don't even know what they doing.

What's going on talk about? What are we gonna sneak talk about? You know what I mean?

>> Yeah.

>> Stupid.

>> They have no idea what they're doing.

It's just unbelievable.

>> Acting like the guys involved in like a body crime or something like, "Oh, we got to keep them separate." What?

>> This is ridiculous, man.

>> That's weird. Yeah.

>> When's your uh when's your court date?

>> Well, I got my ticket right here and it has no court date on it.

>> So, you got to get a hold of them. It's probably going to be soon. Typically your first uh initial hearing like you were you should have had an initial appearance this morning at at uh

>> right at 9 a.m. or whatever, right? But because you were bonded out,

>> but Juice went over there and he said that his he was his name wasn't on the docket, so Brian probably wasn't either.

But

And John, that organization claims a formal internal affairs investigation has been put on hold by the sheriff.

>> That's right, Valerie. They say the request came from the victim who is a deputy herself. Now, she claims she was sexually assaulted by Garcia back in December of last year.

He wants to know what happened, why this

occurred.

>> The Puma County deputies organization has formerly been around since earlier this year. Now, the victim, who was part of the organization, claims Puma County Sheriff Chris Nanos is putting a hold on an internal affairs investigation that she filed against her chain of command.

>> The sheriff's department had six months before the claim the claim was filed against the sheriff's department to make an answer, make a decision on what what was going on. And they never they didn't do it. They say her lieutenant, captain, and chief were aware she was actively being sexually assaulted and refused to intervene for 80 minutes.

>> I think any victim of any crime would want to know um you know what happened and this is specifically her chain of command and the bureau chief was her chain of command and the lieutenant was her chain of command. the sergeant was the was the one that was raping her and she just wants to know why why and what they're doing to do to to fix this situation.

>> We spoke to Sheriff Nanos today who had this to say in response.

>> I'm not going to sit here and allow somebody to question my those who are

out there responsible for the investigation and question their integrity because you didn't like how long it took to make a decision. He also says he did transfer that chief into internal affairs, but there weren't any bad intentions behind it.

>> Internal affairs was always under the chief deputy. The chief deputy retired I think it was March, April. That's four or five months afterwards. This case has already been issued at grand jury. Everything had nothing to do with that.

>> As far as protocol is concerned, a sheriff Nano says internal investigations typically don't happen until criminal cases are complete. Rarely do we do a internal investigation before the criminal's done. You have to allow the courts to have their due process and run through that system and respect that process.

>> Garcia's criminal case is going through Kuma County Court, but is being handled by Santa Cruz County prosecutors to

>> county board of supervisors which passed a \$1.7 billion budget. There is a slight property tax increase, but it is still the second lowest tax rate in the past 10 years. 13 News reporter Bud Foster joins us now. It was a long agenda, Bud. 104 items. Is that a record?

>> Well, I'm not sure if it is, Brooke, but it certainly is very, very close. As you mentioned, the budget there, but they talked about and voted on a myriad of issues today. They set some new rules for call to the audience. They discussed horse racing, affordable housing, Nick yesterday. He

>> and I'm at this particular point just kind of perplexed about I understand there was COVID and other issues and all of the point just kind of perplexed about and I'm

>> we reported yesterday he's way way over budget

>> and I'm at this particular point just kind of perplexed about I understand there was COVID and other issues and all of those things inflation. Yes,

>> the county board was not very happy. The sheriff's department ended the fiscal year \$3.3 million over budget. Sheriff Chris Nanos told News3 that is because staffing shortages forced him to require

his officers to work overtime to the tune of \$9 million this year. Inflation, which has hit household budgets this year as well as record gas prices, caused much of the overage. He said the board was still skeptical. But to go over by not a couple hundred thousand but 3.3 million that's a significant like that that is basically just saying we have a budget. I don't know if I'm going to abide by it or not.

>> Still the board voted to give him money to pay his officers but withheld a million and a half that the sheriff will now have to find elsewhere or take out of next year's budget.

>> Look at Dr. Clown walks out there. The mangdaldas  
I got to tell you.

>> Okay. Thank you, sir. It's that kind of verbal abuse in part which led the board to restrict the time for call to the audience because it had become verbally abusive and went on for hours sometimes. The board had 104 items today to wade through. So it cut the audience members from 3 minutes to 2 minutes each and just over an hour overall. Some were not happy with that.

>> Last meeting you violated our constitutional right of free speech by

voting to limit the time for call to the public. And finally, the board approved a contract for a retail racetrack to hold horse racing for another year. In light of the number of horses which have died in tracks across the country, including the Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs, which lost 10 horses this year, the county still voted 4 to one to hold racing once again. We report zero fatalities in 2023 and there um was some question about that but there were no horse racetrack on the track breakdowns in 2023.

>> Now on affordable housing the county decided that it was not very this is only the beginning.

>> Seems like every year seems like every year none of us has gone over budget.

>> That was 2023. It's like seems like every year it didn't matter.

>> That's what it does. But, you know, I feel like that's too much responsibility for one person. Like that whole county plus the the the jail, all the

You know, they're probably that's what they're cops out there, you know? Like, you know how they pulled up with eight cops for why I needed like really, bro? You you got people in in ditches and and tunnels and all kinds of stuff out here doing

>> Man, listen.

It's unbelievable. Can't believe it.

>> Yeah. Two miles south of NY's yesterday at a bus stop, there's about 20 people getting high at the bus stop selling each other drugs and everything, but they'd rather arrest a streamer sitting in front of somebody's house on a public road.

>> Believe it was around noon yesterday. We got a call to the Guthrie re residence um that

Nancy Guthrie, 84 years old,

>> is that your daughter, Nick,

>> was missing.

We expended a lot of re resources for

>> Was that your daughter, Nick?

>> Oh, that's my granddaughter.

>> Yeah, it's my granddaughter.

>> You're blessed.

>> Oh, man. I'm very very blessed.

>> Very blessed.

>> Yeah.

>> Missing person that we typically always

do. Our search and rescue volunteers,

our search and rescue teams, um uh other

uh agencies, BORSTAR from Border Patrol

sent their canines out. Uh they

>> Oh, that does look like the Tesla all  
day yesterday.

>> Oh, him. Yeah. Remember he kept saying  
the FBI was with me. He's a detective.

>> He works with Yeah. Yeah,

>> that's not FBI. Never has been.

>> And all day tonight, I'm sorry. All day  
yesterday and all all last night.

>> I think there was Why was I think there  
was something he said about the video  
why I wanted to see this, but  
to know about as I said yesterday, we  
saw um some things at the home that were  
concerning to us. We believe now after  
we've processed that crime scene that we

do in fact have a crime scene that we do  
in fact have a crime.

>> To me that's always been the funniest.

It's a crime scene. We do have a crime.

>> This guy's brilliant. This guy's  
brilliant.

>> Got my um

>> and we're asking the community's help.

>> Oh, you are. This community is always

>> the what?

>> No, he's not. He said ask the community  
for help. He's lying.

>> Lying every time he opens

>> his resume. Yeah.

>> And then he starts telling us like his  
job description. Like we don't want to  
hear that [ \_\_ ] You learned

>> Yeah.

>> with his D average high school like

>> to help us solve some pretty tough  
crimes.

Uh I'm looking for that again.

Uh this is a

>> 84 year old lady who um

>> suffers from some physical ailments.

>> Uh has some physical challenges

>> is in need of medication.

>> Plug it in.

>> Medication that if she doesn't have in  
24 hours,

>> yeah,

>> it could be fatal.

>> So we make a plea to anyone who knows anything

>> over here

>> who has seen something heard something.

>> Call 911.

>> We don't

>> we don't need another bad tragic ending. We need some help. Our team is is is

>> the worst,

>> the best. I can't speak any higher. I think you know that

>> I muted it. Done great work with our partners in the valley. you know, this community. I have to give a lot of thanks to our law enforcement agencies, the uh all across this valley, whether it's uh the Tucson Police Department or uh some of the smaller agencies. They've all reached out. They've all offered to assist uh the FBI. I think I realized I think I know why I pushed his I pushed his button because I I'm almost positive because every time because I I don't want to make it seem like it's about me, but there's a lot of things I put out there that he would always somehow correct the next couple days,

>> right?

>> I think the part that he's upset about

is that

>> I said, "Prove me wrong." He kicked Tucson PD off the case because they were on the case early on. I know for a fact and now I have two sources that that they were on the case and the other day I was like prove me wrong that he didn't kick him out because they're not on the case. So not only did he slow down FBI coming in but he kicked Tucson PD off the case that

>> I didn't know. Yeah, I didn't know that.

>> Yeah,

>> man. If would have been involved that would have been such an idiot.

>> They would have solved it, bro. They they have the resources. They would have, Dude, they go through crime daily. They're, you know, that's a real police force. You know what I mean?

>> Where this is just a bunch of It's a clown show. Really?

>> Even in the jail, bro. They're full of themselves in that.

all that data we have from the home from

uh different pieces of technology we've

gotten and we will use that to our

advantage

>> the reason I bring this up is

>> what

>> are the mics too tall so he can't have

them up is that why they're like laying

flat because he's too short I'm short

but is that why

>> well no they put they gave him a few  
phone books to stand on so that way he  
was a little higher

cuz if not now you don't even see his  
badge. He's like this um

>> that you know I'm a cop. I hate  
politics.

>> Dude, we're talking about Nancy Guthrie  
and every interview I hear him about  
he's telling us that he's not a  
politician.

>> Dude, what does that have to do with  
Nancy? Dude, what the [ \_\_ ] wrong with  
this clown, bro?

>> Is he like

>> polit

being a cop? You're involved in  
politics. What are you talking about?  
What are you talking about?

>> Yeah.

>> You guys think he has dementia? Because  
there's other times I've seen him do  
interviews where he sounds like he could

>> We need more staffing. We need a lot of things, but what I really need is I need the committee's help with this. So, I want to make sure I didn't before I take any questions. Um, it is a crime scene. We know that.

>> And and you know what's crazy? They judge book by a cover, right? But when the bicycle groups come in to the schools and to the uh the children's hospital, they don't look at them funny when they're donating of dollars worth of stuff to the kids and all this.

>> Right.

>> Good point.

>> Yeah. He's looking at you see January 11th him standing out in front of Nancy house. He looking at it already.

>> I'm just saying those shoulders are pretty distinct, man.

>> I'm not good at matching faces and bodies, but damn. Yeah,

>> that was a quick

>> Damn. Damn.

>> A quick picture, Alex. A quick picture in front of N.

>> Yeah. You know, he's let me show you I can do it.

>> Speak. Let me say this. We've um we've not just thrown our search and rescue team out there. They they are going to be doing some doortodoor with our criminal investigation team. It is not just our homicide unit. All of our criminal investigation detectives. I I went out last night to the scene. There were probably a hundred cars out there.

All

>> what

>> I think 857 will tell you there wasn't a 100 cars out there. There weren't 100 cop cars.

>> I wasn't there the first night, so I don't know. But I know the next day

there wasn't any cop cars.

>> Well, he was out there earlier than he claims because if you go by the 911 call,

>> um he was on the call talking to one of the deputies telling the deputy what to do.

>> Wow. earlier on. I thought he didn't even show up or even know anything about the case till like seven or whenever he showed up to that the first.

>> He is on a 911 call actually giving instructions to the deputies as to what to do.

>> That's him giving the instructions.

>> That's Nano's voice. Go back and put a pair of Go back and play it and put a pair of earbuds in. You're going to hear that man's voice. That's Awesome.

>> Doesn't it seem like he's like he's like overselling it? Like he's like really trying to oversell all the things he's doing. It just seems very uh suspect there.

>> One time.

from what I've heard.

we just

>> don't bother me when I'm at my  
basketball game.

>> Safe. Another one I remember I I don't  
remember which video it was but like

they were like just give give her up or something like it was almost like if it was she was like a pet you know like if you just go and drop her off there or drop her off at the clinic or sheriff you mentioned that she didn't just walk out is there any like additional information that you can give us on what may have alluded to this being a crime

>> you know I I wish I could. I I I really do. I know that everybody wants to know certain things.

>> What?

>> I can't do that for the

>> Everybody wants to know certain things, Ted.

>> Yeah. People want to know certain things like what your job, your transparency, what's happening in the case.

>> He is so noticulate at all. He just says

>> he talks like he's in third grade, bro.

It's education.

>> I mean, and it's like those other ones, you could tell he he had some scripted stuff, but anytime he's off the cuff like that, you're right. He's like a kindergartener, you know.

>> Did you take that and you're ready to lie? And I would be inappropriate at this time.

>> I'm not I I again don't want to get into that. David, do you can you see anything? David, you've been up all night, but you don't have the answer.

>> At this time, it's like still very active in investigation that we there were circumstances.

>> Why does Nos have him in handcuffs, though?

>> Yeah.

>> Quit your job, [ \_\_ ] You You better say what you were supposed to say up there. They should unc at least uncuff him while he's talking. on scene um that that we believe are are suspicious in nature I think is the best way to put it. Uh but we can't really get into a whole lot of details with that.

>> Go ahead and step back.

>> We don't know that. We don't we we we look at all of that but we just don't know that.

>> Do they have cameras at home?

>> Do they have cameras?

>> Yeah. Phoenix. Yeah.

>> Yeah. Phoenix. Phoenix.

>> After that picture came out, they had to  
go. You got to get up out of my police  
station. You got to go.

>> Right.

>> And GG. And Gigi. And like, correct me  
if I'm wrong, but basically what he's  
saying is like, hey, the guy behind me  
has been up all night. We're on day two.  
We're shutting down search and rescue.

>> We're not mentioning anybody's name. And  
if you have a picture of some old lady,  
send it to us.

>> Yes. Yeah. Snapshot. And Oh, yeah.  
or a video. Or a video, whatever.

>> A video. Take a Polaroid and play.

>> And I'm forcing the detective to be up  
there because he has yet to move his  
hands from behind his back the whole  
time.

>> He's under arrest. I'm telling you.

>> Yeah, he forced

>> They double cuff my ass. They always do because they know.

>> Yeah,

>> that's

>> he's cuffed. Dude, you're dude, you going to say

>> probably can better answer it than I.

But that is our search patterns I believe. Is that correct?

>> Who's he looking at?

>> Wrong way, dude.

>> Oh, he moved his arm.

>> So, he is free. Damn it. Hey, but so they're talking about the search patterns. I think Sleuth Intuition might have got a snapshot of it, whatever they're talking about where the places that they did search. Dude, this is

>> Dude, this is the next day. They only search less than 24 hours,

>> probably 12 hours. is um basically the tracks that were followed. Um those are all uh the lines are all ground tracks of different teams from different uh

>> see it right there.

>> Sleuth [ \_\_ ] got a snapshot zoomed in

>> like

you did all that. Dude, come on. They didn't do that.

>> He lying.

>> He lying.

>> Maybe by the air. Maybe in the air but not on the ground.

>> There you go. That makes sense. GG. Not on the ground.

>> Not on the ground. You lying.

>> Yeah.

>> And what's And what's crazy too is is so like a week after this case, you know, started, me and my wife's friend went to do a search, right? It was my first live actually. So it actually was probably like a couple weeks after the case started, me and my wife went out and we were in a lake uh a wash over by Camino Riale, right? Like a mile and a half uh east of NY's. We're in this wash and one of these neighbors in this neighborhood come up to us and she's like, "What are you guys doing?" We're like, "We're just helping search for anything we can find, clues to this Nancy investigation."

She's like, "You don't think the police have been here? You don't think the FBI have been here?" I'm like, "Look, we're just trying to help out."

>> And then she goes, um, she straight up says, um, well, this is private property. I'm like, man, this is a wash. And I'm looking at like I was looking at the uh the match things on the Puma County public, you know, land website

and I'm saying I'm like this isn't private property. I don't see any signs of no trespassing. She's like, well, we just acquired this property 6 months ago. It is private. And I just looked at her and I said, you know, had you guys been like this two months ago, Nancy would probably still be alive

>> or, you know, still be here and around. But you guys are hounding people that are trying to help with this case doesn't make sense. It was just strange. Yeah. If you didn't like what what you were doing, can't you just move on? Instead, they want to find something else, which makes everything even stranger, you know?

>> Yeah. They're just all bored and retired up there. And they're like, perfect drama for us.

>> Well, we don't know if they live there or not, you know.

>> Yeah.

>> You got to be evil mean to live up in there.

>> Did you take that in there? You got any names?

>> Do that again.

>> The circles are

>> Did you put it on the bed?

>> Hey, Alex.

>> Is this going to be me versus Nick RPG when I'm the point guard versus the other guy?

>> Yeah. Well, one of them, you might have to go against him and Juice. That's what they called their original team. house three day.

>> I'm a shooter.

>> What what what this really helps with is our search teams when they come back and reassess, maybe they missed an area, we can look at it and say, use a little more coverage and so they concentrate again.

>> Oh, [ \_\_ ] another guy. Actually,

>> our search and rescue team is topnotch. They they're they're out every single day. If it's not a lost person, it's a hiker, it's somebody who's wandered away from a care home, whatever it may be. I want to stress to you, and it is really important.

>> It's really important, guys.

>> Miss Guthrie, Nancy Guthrie,

>> Nancy

>> is of great sound mind.

>> I don't know if that's what they were talking about. Nancy, guys,

>> sharp as attack.

>> She's sharp as attack.

>> Family wants everybody to know this isn't somebody who just wandered off.

She her her physical limits are based on

>> the family wants us to know that she didn't just warm her up.

>> I mean, no, I really like that because it's almost letting us know is maybe Savannah was the loud one who was like she didn't just [ \_\_ ] walk away. This is a crime. You know what I mean?

>> Right. Right.

>> And maybe

>> Absolutely.

>> I still want to hear the 911 call. I doubt we ever will, but adjust age and you know we get old and and so it's more physical but

>> clearly she is sharp as attack

>> hey what's up

>> we're on live

>> we're looking at that as we

>> What's up

>> we do have it

>> yeah we're just watching this [ \_\_ ]

last night. She looks really she's

>> I believe what happened there was it um 9:45 in the evening

off

>> at some time early that morning they got a call from somebody at the church who said, "Hey, your your mom's not here."

>> Um the family went to the house. I'm thinking they they spent some time before they called this on this. Maybe they got there around 11. So they did some searching and realized we need help and they they got there around 11. So they Hey, your your mom's not here. Family went to the house.

>> I'm thinking they they spent some time looking for her themselves before they called us. So I'm guessing it in there. Okay.

and searching and realized need some help and they call 9

>> there's a lot of things working there

>> take a a snapshot or video and then send it to us

>> see who

>> that's something I'm going to share with

>> we we we've spoken to her uh we continue to work with that uh she has a security team that's been in Kentucky

>> throughout the night um but we we're We're not going to dismiss any angles for sure, but right now immediately we don't know of anything like that.

>> Why don't they have a person with sign language like next to him?

>> That's what I like to do.

>> Yeah, I know.

>> They don't do lies.

>> He's going to be a change tomorrow.

>> He's going to be a new cat.

>> Oh my goodness. Call

>> Well, first of all, I'd ask them go through their cameras. that

>> go through their their Ring cameras, whatever cameras they may have. Don't dismiss it that, "Oh, well, we really can't see the house." They still might see something. Maybe it's somebody walking by. Maybe it's a vehicle driving by at that time. But go through all your cameras in that neighborhood and tell us if you see something. Maybe somebody already, we know this happens, right?

>> Oh, I saw something suspicious, but I didn't think it was worth calling in, so I didn't call in. Well, now it's sus.

Call in anything you've seen or heard. Maybe it's a neighbor telling you, you know, I saw this or I heard that.

>> Well, that's what I

>> don't tell the neighbor to call us. Tell the neighbor to call us, but you call us as well.

>> Um, we'll put it together.

>> Don't tell the neighbor to call us. Call the neighbor to I'm sure inundated with a lot of calls. We'll handle that.

>> I believe. Yes, she did.

>> Nobody actually lives with

>> house staff that comes by, takes care of the yard, whatever, and house and that, but uh those people will be talking,

say she's of great sound mind and she is mobile. It's just it's a challenge for her to get as a family system.

>> Oh my god. He's talking in circles now.

>> People feel unsettled. Uh I would not say fearful, but obviously this is shocking. This is a very quiet, safe neighborhood. Uh we've lived here six

years. It's actually a wonderful, wonderful neighborhood. Fizz was a horrible event. Uh uh and we're obviously hoping for her safe return.

>> Nice. Paul,

>> El Price, what's up? Can you hear me?

>> Yes, sir.

>> Welcome aboard.

>> Welcome. Thank you.

>> You got anything you want to throw in there? Let us know where you're at in the case. Anything new?

Not that I know, man. It's all family.

>> All family.

>> I think I think I think Cameron planned it and carried it out and that was Luke at the porch. They had 10 hours to get rid of her body.

>> Remember?

>> The ransom notes were not following the wrong one. Kelsey, what's up, Kelsey?

>> Hey, Alex.

>> How you doing? What's up, Kelsey?

>> Good.

>> Good to see you.

>> Good to see you. How are you, Alex?

>> I'm doing blessed. You know, I'm fine.

You know, I'm I'm over it. I seem like my kids having to see that, but if anything, if the if it makes NY's name

out there more, hey, more more power to it. I'm not really worried about the misdemeanors. I mean, it's a bunch of bull.

>> Yeah. Yeah. I I know. Oh, I know you're a strong guy, but hey, I just want to put it out there like, you know, you you're getting a little emotional earlier and I want you to know that not a single one of us out there is going to judge you for that. Everyone has the right to do that. You went through some [ \_\_ ] You have every right. So, don't even think that we're going to be out there judging you for that. All right.

>> Oh, you're awesome. Thank you.

>> And uh couple things just to get some [ \_\_ ] out of the way here.

>> Yeah.

>> So, quick question. Did they specifically tell you now after all this that you cannot go back out there?

>> Nope.

So that also brings me to something else here too is you know working in public relations and all that you know if you do have a lawyer again none of our business but if you do speak to your lawyer about defamation of character because the Puma County Sheriffs and all these media stations who are putting out all this information that is incorrect information

>> can be looked at as defamation of character because it is not factual information.

>> They said, "I'm throwing urine and I there's no fact there's nothing of me throwing urine."

>> Yeah. And we all were all watching

>> and that was from a public statement from the sheriff's department. Right.

>> Right. Yeah. So if Justin, you know, throwing it out there, if you talk to your lawyer, ask them about defamation

because

you listen, a lawyer is going to have a

[ \_\_ ] field day with this

>> field day. Yeah, for sure.

>> Like this is out of hand. And it's just crazy. I can't believe like last night I had just hopped on juices like real quick to check in to see what was going on and it was when everything was going down and then immediately like a couple minutes later and like the KVOA was posting and I was like whoa whoa whoa. How is this all happening so fast here?

This makes no sense.

Then it clicked with like

>> everybody can see and hear me.

>> Oh man, you're mute. You have to turn on your TV. Go ahead. Keep keep going.

Kelsey,

>> they they clearly were in on all of this together. KVOA and the police department because

>> I mean we were watching juice and as we're watching things happening they're already posting on their social media literally within minutes

>> that interviews

that where he's talking about that this is about to happen and then it happened

>> and it was pre clearly pre you know everything's pre-taped so how long have

they been

>> oh I'm so livid Alex

>> no no I feel you and that's why I love doing this because I have people like you and everybody encouraging us like we're pissed because I was pissed. I told a lot of uh deputies off last night. They're almost like kind of mocking me that I'm there. I don't know.

>> The only one that was nice was on the way out. Somebody said, "Oh, you're the famous YouTuber." I go, "What are you talking about?"

>> Nice.

>> You got a whole bunch of people outside waiting for you. I go, "What?"

>> That was a blessing.

>> Yeah. I was I told myself I was like I'm not going to sleep until I know that these boys are out and I watch

>> but I appre you guys are all awesome but me and

>> yeah I was tough asleep last night.

>> It just sucks. You know what I was I was ready to spend the night and I didn't have to. So that was even better. What's up you?

>> Good. How you doing?

>> Love seeing you there last night. Made my night.

>> Wow. It was a fast run yesterday. All I remember is uh sitting around and all of a sudden turning into um Juice and watching him getting arrested and immediately I went into action and I I knew that we needed to get to a bail bondsman immediately because they have good contacts.

>> Yeah.

>> Because we weren't finding anything on the system yet. So, um, Manurva and I headed on over there immediately and, uh, yes, they got a hold of records and, um, she went ahead and looked it all up and said, "I'll get them in there." You know, and, um, and then once we had that information, then, uh, we headed across to get, um, the the money bags. At that point, we didn't know that that Nick uh was also raising money. So, we were um pulling money together from all places. So, we knew what the bond was going to be. And uh it was crazy. It was just fast, one fast move after another. And uh and the good thing is that uh um the bails bondsman also ended up giving me the contact for records. So later on once we paid the bond and the bond was paid I should say because Nick took care of Alex and we took care of Juice. Um

>> right

>> then I ended up calling records and saying uh okay everything's paid up and uh because everybody else was telling us all around like even the bondsmen and and some other people from the uh sheriff's office were saying they got to go to court until tomorrow morning. They missed the 8:00 p.m., but they will be seen at 9:00 a.m. And I was like, "Now I'm not going to settle for them staying overnight, so I'm going to keep searching." So then I called,

>> right?

>> Yeah. I called the records and then I said, "Everything's paid up." And she said, "I'll tell you what. I'll make a deal with you. Tell everybody to stop calling us and I will type as fast as I can the release papers." And I said, "Eal, D." Yep. Okay.

>> And that's when we got the word out for everybody to stop calling this jail.

Stop. And um and she kept her word which was cool. So she even said, "Look, just keep looking at the website and when you don't see them there anymore,

>> then you know that I have released them." And I said, "Cool."

>> You know, Wenita, I had no clue that like when you send money through Cash App, it doesn't come that day. It takes

a couple business days. Is that true?

Well, it it depends like in a on a ver

sometimes like on the amount

>> and also on like some kind of

verification if for some some instances

you haven't been like fully verified or

you've you know

>> Yeah. Yeah. Because I'm not fully

verified. Right. Right.

>> Right. But if you have done all of that

with your cash app then um

>> and then I would just suggest always

small send small increments. Oh, okay.

>> Um, you know, like 50 just in 50s and

then that goes a lot quicker.

>> They'll go quicker.

>> So, sometimes too, Ted, if you have like

your bank account or anything linked to

any of those, sometimes your bank could

even flag it because they don't know

that it's like a third party. You know

what I'm saying?

>> Oh, yeah. Because I I never set it up

before and I was trying to link my bank

account and it was giving me

Okay, that's interesting. Know.

>> Yeah. So there's just all those little

tricks to try to when you're trying to

get money somewhere real fast.

>> Yeah.

>> Usually you get right away though. You

just have to verify it. But really just  
I don't even think you have to verify  
cash app. You just have to hook your  
bank account up.

>> Okay.

>> If you connect your bank account, it  
helps. Yeah.

>> Welcome in. Rea  
and Randy. Hi.

>> What's up? Hey. What's up everybody?

>> Hello.

>> How you doing Alex? How you doing Ted?  
This is Risa. How you doing?

>> Bless you. Nice to meet you.

>> Great. I'm calling from Florida. First  
of all, I want to tell you guys I loved  
your Las Vegas trip. It was the best. Me

why is she so like in with the police  
department? Like what is her deal? Like

>> she thinks she's a cop.

>> Well, she needs to get over her damn ass hag self, you know? I am so sick of that witch. It's just ridiculous. And I know millions of people are as well. She just needs to get herself a life. Maybe a death.

One of them will be fine.

You know, I think truly she just needs to educate herself because she didn't she clearly doesn't know the laws. Like when she that day when she came out there to talk to you, Alex, I was, you know, you didn't say anything. Props to that.

>> But the way she was just like, "Don't film me. I'll sue you. Don't film my property. I'll sue you." Like, "No, go educate yourself, woman. You clearly don't realize that if you are in public, anyone can record you.

>> Anyone can record from the street in your house. It doesn't matter. Like any normal person knows this stuff. It drove me nuts.

>> private

Annie hired them,

>> right? So, who the hell is this guy?

>> But that makes a lot more sense now because you're right. She didn't hire PI. But it doesn't mean that they didn't,

>> right? With NY's money

>> probably. And we know that there's a security at their house, too, because

that one lady confirmed it face to face  
with the security.

um on I know in the state of Oklahoma

where I live uh a misdemeanor has to be committed in our presence and I believe that's throughout the United States. So, if I don't see you commit a misdemeanor, uh, I can't go to your house and [ \_\_ ] put handcuffs on you. That's total total [ \_\_ ] [ \_\_ ]

>> Um, you know, and then when the guys were sitting out there and the cops come by and said, uh, you know, hey, how's it going? Uh, you know, you guys are, you know, basically you're fine sitting there. You're off the road into the little dookie patch where [ \_\_ ] Sue Ellen made,

>> right? Uh um [ \_\_ ] I mean, how much great goose you got to drink to [ \_\_ ] take a [ \_\_ ] on on the side of the road. But anyway, uh you know, and they said everything was fine with him and then they turned around and sat there and then uh comes up and arrest him. That's entrapment by definition.

>> That's like me saying, "Hey, you know, we're at a stoplight." and say, "Hey, Alex, you know, all right, I'm in my police car and you're in your car." And they say, "Just race." And you know, you say, "Hey, am I gonna get in trouble? You know, am I good?" And you're like, "Yeah, I'm good." And so we take off

entrament by definition. They can't do it. It's [ \_\_ ] And uh and old Grey Goose Lady, god damn. I don't see how you [ \_\_ ] put up with that. And that's what we me and my wife were discussing why. I mean, they're wanting you guys out of there for a reason. It it's it's something is >> Yeah. Something [ \_\_ ] ain't right with that, bro. And uh man, I I love you guys. We watched you on the the road trip. I laughed my ass off. >> Uh yeah. I mean, you guys were great. Uh I can't you know, I uh have all the respect in the world for you guys. Uh

you know, I mean,

>> Alex, you bro, you could be a comedian

uh easily. Uh you I love the way you're

you know you're witty, you snap back

really quick. Uh it but

I just had to come on and just say

something because I mean I was just

[ \_\_ ] so pissed, bro.

>> That uh you know when it comes to like

failure to appears, you know, like if

you don't show up

>> warrant the judge issues a warrant, you

know, right there

>> depending on how powerful that warrant

or you know the charges are. Like you

said, if it's a misdemeanor, chances are

it's probably gonna if I get pulled over

in someone's car and they run my name

in, oh, you got a warrant. But they're

not going to go to my house for a

failure to appear for a misdemeanor. So,

you said is is key because I remember

reading that on another case I was

looking into where

>> I would have had to do it in their

presence. I guess being live on video is

in their presence.

>> No, no, no, no, no.

>> No. you I have or uh

>> get with your own eyes.

>> Yeah. P I as a police officer well which I'm retired and I couldn't be a police officer these days because I'd be choking people out all the time but uh like especially like Sue Ellen [ \_\_ ] man she's a nut

>> on the force over here.

>> Oh yeah I I could get [ \_\_ ] done. I can tell you that. But yeah, a misdemeanor has to be um

>> and they came up five. They pulled up four Puma County Sheriff K9 or not Kines's SUVs and then a detective car.

>> I mean it's like uh I mean for that I mean it doesn't make sense. I mean, do they think you're going to fight them or something? Or I mean,

>> better though. I mean, if they're calling it in and they're they could see the live, they're like, "Well, they're saying that he's lighting a fire. Are they lighting a fire?" No. Well, then that's probably

cuz  
>> Yeah, we would.  
>> We we see it all at the same time. And  
uh you know, it's just uh I really  
really appreciate what you you gentlemen  
are doing. Uh all of y'all, Miss Wanita,  
uh I mean just uh just really stand up  
people that would go to bat for you no  
matter what. You know, like last night I

was, you know, we sit there and watch  
worried about you get, you know, being  
in [ \_\_ ] jail

>> for the for the you know, [ \_\_ ]

[ \_\_ ] Oh my god. I guess. So, I  
mean,

>> anyway,

>> I'm going to have a stroke before I

>> Yeah, we want to keep you happy, man.

>> We're safe. Me and J are safe, you know  
what I mean? And we're still going to  
keep fighting for our rights, you know?

>> Yeah, man. It seemed like, you know, I  
mean, if you look at it, um, you know,  
Juice was the first one to get a ticket  
for, you know, getting arrested. The  
gentleman's, uh, you know, darker  
complexed than me and Alex. I mean, I'm  
Native American. I live on a reservation  
here in Oklahoma.

So, uh, you know, we get picked on a  
lot, too, just because of our skin  
color. Uh, you know, and, um, it's just,  
uh, kind of odd to me that, you know,  
they focused on him first and that  
definitely, you know, is that not am I  
off on that or I mean,

>> no, no, it's racial.

>> That's accurate.

>> That's accurate. Yeah.

>> No one really wants to pull the race

card, but when it's in your face,  
>> you can't you can't miss this.  
>> No, right.  
>> I mean, I was as soon as that happened,  
I was like, "Oh, shit."  
>> And you know,  
>> I picked up on that right off.  
>> I don't think they  
pick on me because I'm a housekeeper.  
>> See, the relationship, they like to pick  
on me because I'm a housekeeper.  
Because if the relationship doesn't work  
out, I keep the house.  
>> That's right.  
>> That's great.  
>> Well, the way this is going, Alex and  
Juice are going to own Pima County. So,  
>> yeah,  
>> Alex mayor,  
>> a lot of people are saying like,  
lawsuits and all that. You know what?  
That's the last thing on my mind. Trust  
me, I know that everybody's like, you  
need to get a lot. I get it. But that  
costs money, too. Sometimes they'll do  
prono, but really I don't want to take  
away from the Nancy case. Like, okay, if  
I could get that that might take 10  
years, that might take four lawyers. I'm  
not worried about  
>> or it could bust tomorrow. I mean,

>> you're right. Hey, you know, I've had cases where I sat there, you know, and I was telling my wife, I was like, I work like, you know, 40 hours straight on cases,

>> you know, I mean, just trying to drink coffee, you know, not even liking the taste of coffee, but drinking it just to stay awake so I could work this case mind at the time or whatever, right?

>> Yeah. I mean, you can't, you know, as as a detective, you can't

>> uh get it out of your mind like Alex of what you're talking about, you know, you you can't stop and get it out of your mind,

>> right?

>> And you would be a good detective, bro. I would I would uh I would hire you in a second at my sheriff's office.

>> So,

>> you know, because I remember years ago my dad helping him investigate cases and and he'd be like, I can't go to sleep. I can't sleep until and then he'll wake up thinking about things and

>> it's nuts.

>> It's a wild

banana case. Oh man, those are nut. Like at those times they were just driving me nuts. It's like this case driving me

nuts right now.

>> Just trying not to show it.

>> Yeah. No, I I definitely understand. you know, I've been divorced, uh, you know, twice because I'm, you know, law I was in law enforcement and, you know, I couldn't get stuff out of, you know, you get stuck in this case and you, you know, all you think about is the victim.

>> It must be tough in the relationship. I bet.

>> Yeah. I mean, it takes a special family and everything to give you that support because it takes a special person to be in law enforcement. Uh, in Puma County's uh um uh case, the special person is uh kind of um I can't say the R word. What do I say? There's somebody mentally challenged. That's it. I'm I'm I'm 56, so I have to watch what I say. I don't want to piss anybody out.

>> Right. Hey, but if anybody's smarter than him, they can't work there. You feel me?

>> Yeah. Exactly. Exactly. So, uh Yeah. Um, well, you know, I was getting ahead on about talking about, you know, being that uh MR uh

>> so or yeah or whatever their challenge.

The sheriff is definitely uh

>> touched.

>> Yeah,

that's a good word for it.

>> Definitely

>> politically correct. Touched.

>> Yeah, he's defin definitely touched. And

>> you know when uh he was doing the the

interviews there on scene, I was like,

"Oh, Jesus. This is not the sheriff,

right?" I mean, he's just, you know,

they would ask him questions and he'd

have that ghost, you know, deer in the

headlight look like, "Uh, well, you

know, I was like, Jesus Christ, man."

You know, this is the head of this

agency that has 1500 people working for

him.

Yeah.

>> And um

>> sorry I don't mean to interrupt. Just

Wenita when we first met like

>> from as helpful where you were to me to

drive me everywhere to give me the

knowledge of the streets of the like um

the atmosphere of the easement all the

audiences of how the lay of the land

was. I mean, it it it was amazing to

meet you and how generous you were to

drive me anywhere and then educate me on

everything in the whole lay of the land

and the like the political atmosphere. I

just thank you so much. I I can't thank

you enough, Wita.

>> Well, thank you, Ted. And it was a pleasure meeting you, too. I tell everyone you're a true gentleman.

>> Um, you know, when the camera is off, you're just, you know, wonderful gentleman. And We enjoyed your company.

It was a pleasure uh getting

>> Oh, it was a blessing to meet you. I had so much fun and you know every rule possible and it was just it was so much fun everything. She really is she has a lot knowledge

>> of a lot of Yeah.

>> Yes.

>> life too. Not just the knowledge but just on how to navigate through life, you know.

>> Navigate through life. Right. Exactly.

Yeah. It's like it's like yesterday everybody telling me stop don't go wasting your time over to the bail bondsman because we're not it's not going to be that big of a bond. I said no you don't understand. I'm going for the knowledge and I'm willing to pay for what they got because they have the connections. They are officers of the court.

>> Right.

Is like a second lawyer. Trust me.

>> They know.

>> Right. Yeah. Right.

>> Yes they do. Because guess what? They're not going to put up the um million-dollar bales if they don't if they don't know what they're doing, you know?

>> Right.

>> Well, they were pretty honest. Like he said to me, you know,

>> the kiosk is across the street, but I will work with you. Whatever you need, you got you came here, we talked, we met, we're together. And that was what was really cool.

>> Usually they're outside. Usually they're outside the court.

>> They just they knew where I go in and out and they just saw that I went in and out.

>> Well, it's basically a person that invests money into you.

>> That's I get it. That's why that's why when she's saying that he's an officer of the court, I never looked at it that way, but that's very high. That's important. Really? Yeah.

>> Absolutely. Hey, can I show you guys?

Dozens of media and streamers have been camped out on North Camino Escalante for several weeks after an intensive search began for gutri 84 whoopy woop. So in other words like this camped out. Anyway, let me keep going. Streamers and media members have set up tents, generators, and sometimes satellite trucks along the road creating severe congestion and safety concerns and at times blockages of the quiet neighborhood road. Dude, they had vehicles in the road, but I couldn't be in the road. An attempt starting February to restrict.

Wait, wait, wait. Oneway road to allow traffic flow, but also accommodate the median social streamers has not worked as hoped. Neighbors have continued to complain bitterly as they contend bitterly. Dude, this is off the punic.gov.

So, how many do they have that CFA has

that much pool? That's crazy. Bitterly as they contend with continued clogged roads, trespassing noise, and accumulated trash along the road. I don't know who they're talking about us. Additionally, because of the oneway restriction, streamers and other members of the public have been parking on connecting roads and culde-sac, spreading the congestion.

Uh, let me go back. So to protect public safety and restore the neighborhood to more normal conditions. What the [ \_\_ ] does that mean? More normal conditions. You know what they teach you in Mar? They teach you normal. You know what normal is? A button on a washing machine. There's no normal conditions.

A lady got [ \_\_ ] abducted that allow access to the community for emergency ve they could come up. I didn't stop any emergency vehicles service vehicles.

And here, let me see zone boundaries and duration. Oh, duration.

>> Oh,

>> no, not duration of how long it could be there.

>> Remain until no longer needed. Okay.

Sign is legal authority. Media. Okay.

This is important right here. Media will still be able to access the neighborhood and report from the public right of way. right of way. That's exactly what where I was at. That's my island. But media, >> it's Alex's island. Yeah.

>> Media or streamers will have to access the neighborhood from a legal parking location outside of the zone, get dropped off, or use ride sharing or taxi services. Dude, I didn't break any laws, guys. That's all I'm trying to point out.

>> What if I'm allowed to get dropped off there? I don't have to play hideand-seeK with the sheriff's. It's saying I'm allowed to get off there. Okay.

>> Residents in the no parking zone should, and this is another thing that's important, is that Sue Ellen out there taking standing behind people's cars and taking pictures. That's wrong. If someone's violating an ordinance, you contact the right people. You're not the cop. Island residents in the no parking zone should alert any of their service companies about the parking restriction and that those vehicles will need to park in driveways. For instance, pool exterminator with the whoop will need to

avoid parking along the street in the zone during the temporary prohibition. But anyway, just wanted to make sure I show people that this is the their ordinance.

this entire team here, those behind me  
and our community are hurting with you.

We we really just want mom back. Okay.

Right now we believe Nancy is still out  
there.

>> We want her home. Oh, they hurt so bad.

Oh my

>> god.

>> We should have been taking notes, guys,  
cuz she's out there.

>> She's not in there. In other words,

>> I don't know where in there is, but  
she's out there, guys.

She our department, the sheriff's  
department along with all of our  
partners at the FBI

have been working around the clock  
and and and we just want her home and  
get and and find a way to get to the

bottom of all of this just as you do.

But I have other partners out there who have stepped up and you've probably noticed them in the last few days, if not the last few hours, and you're going to see more of that. I made a decision to contact our picrit team and those of you not local that's our puma regional critical incident team it's made up of law enforcement officers from this entire valley uh Pasuayaki police department Tucson police department police department uh Puma College police there Tucson International police department Serita police department there's so many of them and they are going to help us tremendously and that that's really done because We we have so much in front of us still and we're hoping that you know I know the the the FBI has committed a very large number of men and women to partner with us, work side by side with us. We go do an interview, they're going to be there with us. We we're going to go uh look at some evidence or process evidence, they're going to be right there with us. We're sharing every piece of information, all the data we can to get this thing solved. And it's important that my partners in law

enforcement know and understand um their roles because it is very large complex investigation with a lot of moving parts and it and and we're at that phase now where sometimes we're we're we're we're waiting right we're waiting for analysis. We're waiting for lab reports, but even then when they come back quickly, for example, some DNA, uh, we rushed what we thought was the best target for DNA. We did a rush through and and got some of that back. The the results were minimal. I think you all know of the the the um uh blood on the porch. That was one we did. It it it came back to Nancy. Um, that's that's what we know. Uh but there's still more items that have been submitted. We just haven't got them back yet.

>> But in the meantime, we're not just sitting on our honchases waiting. We do have a number of leads coming in. And that's why we brought in the FBI for one, but Peerrit as well to be able to get out there and handle these leads as they come in as quickly and as expeditiously as we can. And every single lead is looked at. Every one of them. And so we're we're we're hearing that. You probably have some questions about what you've seen in the last

couple of days. I'll gladly answer those at that time.

>> Uh but it really is about getting our partners out there. To be fair, when we went to that scene the first night, Saturday night, uh it was just us. Uh since then, the FBI and others have asked, can we go and see it as well? And that's what you've been seeing.

>> Shane Wayne, you can go ahead and hit my email. Alexander Zable 85 at Gmail and uh we can do a column. If we don't do it today, we can do it another day.

>> But it is a very important case to not just me and my team, but this entire community, all of our law enforcement partners,

>> suspects.

I know there's been a lot out there about suspects and I want to be very clear at this time, we have not identified a suspect or a person of interest in this case. We are working our best to do that. But to be clear, we have nobody of interest or any suspects that you would consider a prime suspect. We're just not there. We're not there yet.

I know underneath that anger and frustration is a great big teddy bear with Alex. Love you guys.

>> Hey,

call D for a second. Is she on?

>> Are you thinking out loud?

>> Be right back.

>> Okay.

Love you. Love you, Donna. You guys are sweet. I got the best chat in the world.

And I I don't know. I should have I should have known that. Uh uh. Uh

>> oh.

I should have known that I would have a lot of people that had my back. So, that's cool. And I was like I knew I was doing the right thing, but it just sucked cuz it happened had to happen in front of my kids. I mean, and I ain't going to lie, as soon as that one cop twisted my arm back, dude, when I didn't even resist or anything, like I know I'm big, but he was about to twist me like where you don't like to get twisted. And I said, "Ma," cuz she was right next door. And then she came outside, so that way she was able to, you know, cuz they weren't trying to deescalate.

After months of neighbors complaining

two yards. I don't I mean I don't know

it's his directive. It's obvious.

>> After months of neighbors complaining

about unlawful behavior in Nancy

>> so is that his word behavior to try to to try to be like I'm the we're the bad guys kind of

>> you know the most beautiful part of the sixth amendment is that a defendant gets to face their accuser.

>> I love and I was thinking that yesterday too. That's one of my

>> all those people that made those calls.

Guess where you're going to be

>> in a big old subpoena case.

>> Oh, I'm a big due process guy. So, yeah, I'm going to love this.

>> Well, now they're going to be subject to arrest and possible jail time if their unlawful behavior continues. Take a listen.

If somebody's just out there from one of our local media outlets or even a YouTuber and they've not been cited,

>> then fine, we'll give you a citation and expect you to be reasonable with us and not come back.

>> I never got a citation. They came to my house to arrest me.

>> But if we happen to look at you and say, "No, we you've you've received a ticket. You've been cited for the same behavior that didn't do

>> what behavior,

Vanita, what was your behavior?

I mean, who else has been cited other than you, J, and myself? I don't or and uh Dam 8 by7.

>> Paying taxes was must behavior.

>> Oh [ \_\_ ]

>> You any good? we didn't put into his campaign or whatever.

>> Actually, yeah. My behavior was that I didn't vote for him in 2016. And that's the whole rage he has with this community is that he lost and he got so upset that he quit the department and he went on a retirement and he blew it on himself because he had to retire on deputy's wage instead of the acting sheriff that he was because he also screwed up his social security because he got the deputy's wage instead of the sheriff's wage. And he thought when he came back in 2020 that he was going to

go ahead and get all his years back. And  
guess what? N

>> but yeah, but he never really uh he  
never retired though, right?

>> He did retire. He retired in 2016. He he  
was upset and he quit because the  
community didn't reelect him. And and  
the thing is that for anybody that  
understands pensions and retirement, he  
made a huge mistake

>> taking that retirement because he  
thought he was going to clock out just  
because he was an acting sheriff for a  
year. He thought he was going to get  
that acting the salary from the sheriff  
versus what he had been for 40 years,  
which was a deputy. And he ended up

offenders. And he goes on to say that he  
has the support from the Pima County  
Attorney's Office in this latest.

>> Look at Monica. I know her well. Why is  
she standing in the street yelling at  
the reporter be like, Monica? Yeah, we

got a reporter and she's got nice hair.

>> move. We will have much more on this story. So, coming up tomorrow,

>> they had the privilege to stand there on the street with all their equipment and film all of this

I'm in custody.

>> Okay. Well, there you go.

>> They got to get a hold of me, right? I'm not going to I don't It's not up to me to call them.

>> Like you said, there should be a date right there.

>> And shout out to the uh personnel at the jail. They did a fantastic job speeding it up. Uh kudos to them.
